Curriculum News from Miss Belzer

The children have been making very good progress in phonics and are enjoying practical games and activities.

The initial concept of phonics is concentrating on developing children's listening and sound association skills, developing the skills to be able to hear and say sounds in words.

The half day children are enjoying playing a range of circle time games to explore sounds and are being introduced to alphabet sounds. The aim is for the children to become attuned to sounds and begin developing the skills to hear the sound at the start of a word.

The full day children are consolidating their letter recognition and are exploring blending. This is when children say each sound that makes up a word and merge the sounds together to hear and say the word.

To support your child at home you may like to try the following game at home.

Wizard's Magic River - Prepare a box/tray with small objects or pictures from around the house (e.g. a peg, bag, cup, pen, cap, pan, jam, mat). Say the words...'Wizard, Wizard can we cross your magic river?' Ask your child to repeat this and to memorise the sentence. You are now the Wizard! Let your child say the sentence to you and you reply saying...'only if you give me the ...' /p/ /e/ /g/, saying each sound clearly for the child to hear the word peg. Repeat with all the objects in the tray.
