Class 7 News

It has been an exciting week in Class 7, particularly with a visit on Wednesday, from Samuel the Scientist.

The children learnt all about teeth in both humans and animals. They made their own human mouth, using mini marshmallows to represent teeth. They learnt about incisors, canines and molars. Samuel then asked the children to help him make toothpaste from household goods. The children successfully dirtied plastic plates and then used the toothpaste to scrub them clean, with a toothbrush, of course!
