IAPS Leadership Conference

For two days last week, I was away from school attending a conference run by IAPS (Independent Association of Prep Schools.) The conference is a fantastic opportunity for learning about current trends in Early Years education, to pick up ideas for teaching and learning, and also to network with other Heads and Leaders. Speakers included Professor Pat Preedy who is a renowned expert in the field of Early Years. She spoke to us with passion and conviction about the importance of play and working in partnership with parents. She also talked about the importance of the process of learning with young children as being as important as the content. I could particularly relate to her expression that as Early Years teachers, we are in the privileged position to give children 'roots to grow, and wings to fly.'

Curriculum News

What are CVC words?

A CVC word is a word that is made up of a consonant - vowel - consonant sound. Cat, pat, tip, man and hut are all CVC words. As children build their confidence with recognising sounds by sight they then begin to 'blend' sounds together to hear and read words. In order to read, children are required to recall the individual sounds with enough fluency to string the sounds together, rather than saying three individual sounds. It is important that children have a firm letter sound awareness. However, they do not need to know all the alphabet sounds before they can start to read CVC words. It is important that children have a solid awareness and recognition of the first 6 letter sounds before moving onto new ones. The first letter sounds taught are s,a,t,i,p,n. A range of CVC words can be built from these words including sat, pin, tap, nap and sip. CVC words are integral as they are the first step from knowing letter sounds to sounding out simple words. CVC words are incredibly rewarding for children, as they allow them to experience and understand the transformation of simple sounds into words.
