Curriculum News

This week the children have celebrated Nursery Rhyme Week and relished in listening to and joining in with nursery rhymes and songs full of rhyming, rhythm and repetition. These core elements help boost children's language, communication and literacy development. Introducing children to a variety of nursery rhymes can help them understand and learn about different sounds. This is an important part of developing early literacy skills. Listening to different sounds in the environment, as well as in nursery rhymes, provides children with the foundations for reading and writing. As nursery rhymes are fun and full of sounds, children tune into these sounds. Older children will experiment with combining sounds and blending them together to form a word.

Nursery Rhymes are important for:

- Learning new words
- Developing non-verbal communication skills
- Learning early maths skills
- Enabling children to copy actions
- Supporting children's social skills
- Learning about different beats and rhythms

Nursery Rhyme Week has provided the opportunity for our children to value language and become confident learners. The children have had fun singing, dancing and making crafts related to many of the best loved and traditional rhymes.
