Curriculum News

In the EYFS, Mathematics is split into two aspects space & shape and measures & numbers. Helping children enjoy Mathematics at an early age is key for them to approach and solve problems. Mathematics is best developed through practical experiences where children apply their learning in everyday contexts such as shopping in the role play area. Role play activities enable the development of mathematical language and children are encouraged to experiment with their own methods of problem solving.

Activities to support Mathematical development at home include:

Playing dominoes

Completing jigsaws and puzzles

Sorting everyday items such as buttons, pasta, toys, socks etc by weight, size, shape or colour Recognising patterns and shapes in the environment

Making a height chart to measure how tall your child is and monitoring their growth

Using a stopwatch on a mobile phone or otherwise
