Curriculum News

Class topics at Broadhurst are mostly centred around the subject area 'Understanding the World'. This curriculum area is broken down into three aspects:

- People and Communities
- The World
- Technology

Children learn about the world around them through touching, holding or experimenting with how things work. It is important for children to have opportunities to explore, investigate and test out their ideas.

People and Communities

As children learn about the world around them they find out about the past through talking to parents, grandparents and friends and they develop an interest in their own story as well as the stories of other families.

The World

Understanding of the world develops as children take notice of everything around them. This aspect also focuses on learning about cause and effect and is developed through having conversations with adults and other children about the things they observe.

Technology

Recognising the role of technology at home or in a setting is important because this helps children to identify the different types of technology and what they are useful for.

Activities at home that will help your child learn more about the world around them include:

- Gardening
- Cooking
- Visiting a Museum
- Collecting, sorting, counting and making patterns with natural materials such as leaves, pebbles or shells.
- Exploring water at bath time and talking about sinking and floating or full and empty.
- Reading, looking at and discussing non-fiction books.


Class 3 News
