Why sewing?

Studies have shown that children, who learn to sew gain many mental as well as physical developmental benefits. It has been found that the various tasks

involved in sewing a simple project, such as following pattern instructions, fabric selection, colour coordination, sizing and fitting all help stimulate creative thinking, promotes self-esteem and


