# **Curriculum News from Miss Belzer**

The curriculum area Expressive Arts and Design involves two aspects:

- Exploring and Using Media and Materials
- Being Imaginative

# **Exploring and Using Media and Materials**

This is focused on how children experiment with media and materials by modifying and manipulating them. It includes exploring sounds, patterns, movement and experimenting with different tools and techniques.

# **Being Imaginative**

This is about children's explorations into the world of pretence, building on their experiences of the real world and transforming them into something new – whether through role play, music, pretend play, block play, small world play or a range of other ways.

Helping children to be creative encourages curiosity and questioning. Encouraging children to use materials and resources in an open-ended way helps them to make choices and to have confidence in their own ideas. Expressing an interest in the process or asking open questions helps children hold onto their remarkable creativity.
