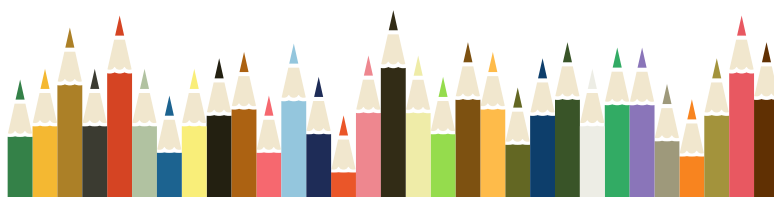

Curriculum News from Miss Belzer

Storybook Yoga

I am very much enjoying visiting all the classes each week and supporting the children's physical and coordination skills. This term the children are joining in with Storybook Yoga. Adapted from Bookworm Yoga, the weekly sessions involve engaging and dynamic movement, stretching, balancing and relaxation skills, inspired by picture books.

Each of the stories feature themes including feeling safe and building a sense of belonging, being confident and brave, persevering, trust and gratitude for our friends and families. Characters in the stories take journeys as they learn to express themselves, seek their place in the world and appreciate those around them.

As the children join in with each of the stretches and Yoga poses, they develop flexibility, strength and body awareness. Yoga supports the development of good posture, core stability and joint mobility, as well as, improving balance and coordination.

Class 6 News

What a wonderful autumnal week we have had in Class 6. The children have loved exploring our autumn investigation area with conkers, acorns, leaves and squirrels. We have loved getting creative and a little messy this week! We used our imagination to create our own autumn painting, using the colours and autumnal materials to inspire us. We used potatoes to create leaf prints. Using real leaves, we made collage pictures and we also used the sponge painting technique to make beautiful leaf pictures.

During maths we have been placing numbers in order. To reinforce this, we made a human number line with the whole class! We have also enjoyed our autumn coloured play dough, taking orders in our role play Café and learning the seasons songs. During our phonics sessions we have begun oral blending. We became blending post people, posting the pictures that were sounded out into our letter box. We also practised our cutting skills and have been learning how to hold our scissors correctly. We are becoming experts now!
