#### Phonics Talk Overview

Thank you to all the parents who attended the phonics talks this week. It was wonderful to see so many of you and we hope the session was informative and helpful. The purpose of the afternoon was to give an overview of how we teach phonics and introduce reading at Broadhurst. For those of you who were unable to attend, please find attached a summary of what was presented.





### ***Winter Readiness***

With the change in the season and the weather, children and staff are particularly susceptible to the spread of infections, such as flu, coughs and colds and gut infections leading to sickness and diarrhoea.

Outbreaks often occur due to the close contact between children and staff. We already have a number of children off School with minor illnesses.

The impact, however, can be reduced by following :

Washing hands is one of the most important things that we can do to help prevent and control the spread of illness.

If your child is unwell, please do not send them to School. Home is by far the best place for them until they are back to full strength.

If your child has had an episode of vomiting or diarrhoea, we operate a 48 hour exclusion policy which we appreciate your adherence to.

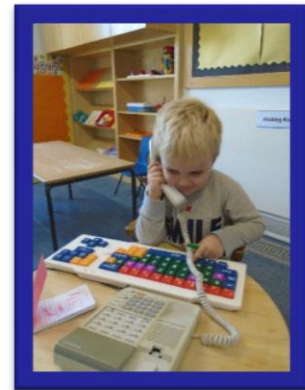
