




Odd one out tasks involve finding the picture that is different from the others. Challenges like this can help to instill crucial traits of logical reasoning and differentiation. As children recognise the odd one out, they are also prompted to explain why it is different from the others. This supports children's general knowledge and verbal reasoning. As children analyse a group of objects, they are challenged to sort, classify, visually discriminate and build observational skills to notice things in detail.
