Chicks Galore!

Class 6 have had so much fun learning about the life cycle of a hen. We have had the amazing hands-on experience of seeing real eggs hatch and reveal brand new chicks!

The children were fascinated to see the chicks moving about. They learnt lots of new vocabulary and it raised lots of questions.

Our small world area was turned into a chicken farm and the children used play eggs and chicks to act out the hatching experience in their play. We also read the story 'The Little Red Hen'. In our creative area, the group made pop-up chicks hatching out of eggs and very feathery chicks with the playdough.

Oscar said, "My chick is called Chicky, he has four feathers and two legs!"

Ravi said "My chick came from a farm. I put on a triangle mouth, two eyes and a fluffy coat."

Ishaan even wrote a sentence about the eggs, 'the eggs are oval.'

For maths we looked at different ways to represent numbers, we used a ten egg box, rolled a dice and counted that many eggs. We then added one more to see how many we had.

A truly 'egg'-citing time was had by all!
