## Class 9 News

Our story of the week, *The Tiger Who Came to Tea*, has inspired our role play area and we have been re-enacting the story and having lots of tea parties this week. In Literacy, we have been developing our comprehension skills to answer questions about the story and thinking of ideas about what would happen if the tiger ever came back again.

Mathematics activities have involved investigating the properties of flat shapes. We are confident about sides and corners and are now working on remembering how many sides and corners different shapes have. We are also being introduced to problem solving which began by playing a dice game. We counted out frogs into a pond and explored who had more or less frogs and the difference between them.
