First Aid is the initial assistance given to any person suffering a sudden illness or injury, with care provided to preserve life, prevent the condition from worsening and promote chances of recovery. Our staff inset at the beginning of term included First Aid training with First Aid for Life. This paediatric first aid course concentrated solely on the infant and child age groups, incorporating best practice and complying with the latest guidelines. Key aspects of the course included CPR, choking, anaphylactic shock and adrenaline autoinjector (Epipen) training, asthma, bleeds, bites and stings, breaks and sprains. Learning skills through both practical and theoretical aspects, staff have built the confidence to use first aid skills in a real-life situation. We hope that we will not need to draw on the skills we now have but are confident that we are ready if the need arises.
