I am so proud of all the children and the resilience and adaptability they have shown since we went into lockdown back in March.

The remote learning has been an overall resounding success and my thanks go to you for your support in making this happen. My teaching staff have found new skills they did not know they previously had, and we have all been on a steep learning curve, demonstrating a true 'growth mindset' in our approach to this challenge.

It has been wonderful to welcome the vast majority of children to school, this half term. Personally, for me, I have welcomed the opportunity to reconnect with you all, albeit, from a safe 'cone' distance on Greencroft Gardens, in most cases. The children have benefitted enormously from re-establishing their friendships and their relationships with their teachers. We have very quickly adapted to our 'new normal' practices and have unexpectedly discovered some improvements to how we work, in the process, for example, the children's independence when saying goodbye to their parents outside, and in full day, managing their own belongings as they come into school. I have heard some parents comment that they find this new system preferable to the busy indoor morning rush we had in pre-coronavirus times. In the garden, with less equipment and resources available to them, we have observed the children's imaginative play developing extremely well and their interpersonal skills as they negotiate and interact with their friends.

As we anticipate the future, and how the world may look moving forward, I do believe we have all learnt some valuable lessons from the last few months, for us to take forward. I am looking forward to next year but will certainly miss the children and families that are leaving us next week. I wish you all the very best for the next chapter.
