## CHARACTERISTICS OF EFFECTIVE LEARNING

The classrooms this week have had many creative, inspiring and engaging activities planned and the children have been thoroughly engaged in exploring all areas. As children play, explore and apply their knowledge they are learning key skills and effective practices for learning. These are known as The Characteristics of Effective Learning.

These characteristics define the way children learn. Each characteristic determines the way children respond to and engage in learning. There are three characteristics of effective teaching and learning:

#### YOU CAN SUPPORT YOU CHILD'S PLAY AT HOME BY:

Showing your own interest in discovering new things.

Join in your child's play and support their ideas.

Support your child to try new activities and solve problems.

Talk with your child about what they are doing, how they plan to do it, what worked well and what they would change next time.



- Playing and Exploring how children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'.
- Active Learning the way children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and show enjoyment and pride in their achievements.
- Creating and Thinking Critically the way children develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.

Nurturing children's creativity, curiosity and perseverance in learning enables individual talents to be developed. When children are engaged and motivated they become effective learners. Open ended activities allow children to explore, experiment and problem solve on their own.

As children explore their classroom independently they will find opportunities to develop their imagination, literacy and phonics, mathematics skills and problem solving, fine motor skills and pencil control, balance and coordination, cooperation and social skills, creativity and much more. These opportunities enable children to acquire mastery of their learning.

# CLASS 9 NEWS BY MISS DANIELLE This term our topic has been animals around

This term our topic has been animals around the world. Class 9 were fascinated to learn about exotic jungle animals like jaguars, snakes and elephants. We discovered all sorts of interesting animal facts: did you know that giraffes have purple tongues, and that baby elephants are called 'cows'?

This week we transformed into adventurous Jungle Explorers! The class created their very own binoculars and we have spotted some imaginary monkeys swinging in the trees outside. We have used our binoculars to hunt in the garden for parrots, snakes and tropical flowers, too!

## IN MATHS THIS WEEK...

In maths we have been investigating number bonds up to 10. The class have used their addition skills to solve many tricky number problems. When counting out four blocks, Aaradhya said, "I know I need to count 6 more blocks to get to 10." Ferdinand also made some interesting discoveries when making the number 5. He said, "The 3 numicon and the 2 numicon fit a bit like a puzzle."













We were very interested to discover that animals in the jungle like hot weather and Class 9 are very excited to welcome some warm weather into the garden as we move further into the summer term!

Our sounding out skills are improving and we are learning to build words like 'thin' and 'moth'.
