Helping them to spot when someone might be upset and to show care and concern

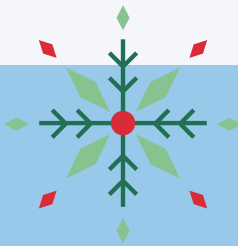
Encouraging acts of kindness
