SCHEMA PLAY

At the beginning of this term our staff team participated in an insightful and inspiring training day about schemas and schema play. Lynnette Brock from Schema Play led us though a number a strategies for supporting children's emerging learning styles and patterns, many of which we have been able to put into practice here at Broadhurst.

The importance of schemas in a child's self-initiated and spontaneous play has become a valued and embedded part of early childhood practice. Schemas are patterns in a child's behaviour that they will repeat in order to learn about and explore their environment. They link directly to the development and strengthening of cognitive structures in the brain.

Schemas play a crucial role in learning as they can influence how quickly and easily a child learns new information.

Schemas enable new information to be classified and categorised by comparing new experiences to existing schemas which supports learning information more quickly and easily. Schemas also allow us to think rapidly, even under conditions when new information is coming in expeditiously, as we can assimilate this new information more automatically.



As a parent schema's can help you understand your child's behaviour. You may have observed your child putting items into and out of containers or bags and hiding them or throwing their toys around the room. It is worth considering whether this behaviour is an expression of a schema rather than challenging behaviour. When a schema is recognised fun activities that match this exploration can support your child in a more constructive way.

Over the coming weeks, I will be focusing on some common schemas and ways these can be supported at home.
