LET'S TALK ABOUT THE CURRICULUM

Phonics Activities at Home

Following my phonics talk this week, I would like to share some easy and fun phonics activities that you can do at home with your child.

Sound Baskets

Gather small toys or items together and then assign a basket or container with a letter sound. Can the children decide which basket the item belongs to?

Mark Making and Letter Formation in Rice Practising letter formation in dry rice is an easy and fun way to develop letter formation and fine motor skills. You will need a tray with edges to help keep the rice inside.

Muffin Tin Sound Sort

Use a muffin tin and cupcake cases to sort small items around your home. Use the initial sound of the item and place it in the muffin tray.

Rainbow Hop Game

Place different sounds on the floor, say a letter sound and encourage your child to jump on that sound.

Throughout these activities it is very important to use the pure letter sounds and not to add an "uh" sound at the end. Please see this useful video here which helps to demonstrate all the letter sounds.

In the garden this week we have focused on the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children have been acting out the story using masks and have been making lots of porridge in the sand area. Our science experiment this week involved making rain in a jar. The children were amazed creating and watching raindrops drip down from a shaving foam cloud!

IN MATHS...

we have been looking at 2D shapes and their properties. We enjoyed making our own houses using shapes and talking about how many sides and corners we could find on each shape. We also spoke about what door number we live at.
