LETS TALK ABOUT THE CURRICULUM

FINE MOTOR SKILLS

The muscles in a child's hand do not fully develop until they reach seven years of age which means that in the early years, we work on strengthening the muscles in the hand and fingers. Fine motor skills are when we use the small muscles in our hands and wrists.

How can we help to strengthen children's fine motor skills?

Encourage the use of zips, buttons and buckles: By encouraging children to try to zip up their coat, do the last button or attach a buckle we are building up the muscles in their hands. We can attach the zip to our children's coats and then let them pull it up the rest of the way. By encouraging these small steps, we are not only developing some independence but also strengthening fine motor skills through everyday activities.

Using pegs, tweezers and tongs: These items help to strengthen the muscles in the fore finger and thumb. See below some examples of activities: **Playdough:** Playing with playdough encourages children to roll, press and stretch the dough all using their hands. It is lots of fun too! See below how to make some quick and easy playdough for your child at home.

1 Cup Flour

2 tbsp Oil


1/4 Cup Salt

Food Colouring

1/2 Hot Water

Fine motor skills continue to be an important aspects of the Early years curriculum and they underpin many other curriculum areas. Developing strong fine motor skills will help children for when they are ready to write. Strengthening muscles in the hand will make it easier to hold and control a pencil in the future.
