LETS TALK ABOUT THE CURRICULUM

THE BENEFITS OF MESSY PLAY

Messy play is an important part of early years provision and although it can be much to clean up, the benefits are strong. Messy play involves children exploring sensory materials using their hands. Messy play can involve shaving foam, cooked pasta, corn flour, jelly, and much more. Within the messy play setup, there are often additional resources added to enhance children's experiences, for example, bowls and spoons.

What are the benefits of messy play?

It evokes curiosity and exploration to discover what the material feels like. It is a great way to introduce children to new textures or to experience a familiar material in a different way.

It supports concentration skills as messy play is often highly engaging.

It encourages language development and often introduces new vocabulary.

It encourages descriptive language as children are able to describe the exciting textures.

It develops hand-eye coordination as it urges children to examine objects and materials closely.

It is beneficial for fine motor skills as children manipulate materials using their hands and fingers.

EXAMPLES OF SOME EASY MESSY PLAY SET UPS:

Using cooked spaghetti is a wonderful way to inspire children's imaginative play. They often role-play familiar experiences such as cooking dinner. Adding food colouring to the spaghetti can make the play even

more enticing.





Shaving foam is wonderful on its own but by adding paint children are encouraged to explore colour mixing.



Flour is a quick and easy way to add texture to play. It is great to add transport as children can make marks with the tyres.

Shredded paper can be a great way to add a different dimension to play.



CLASS 2 NEWS
