EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN



What is Expressive Arts and Design?

At Broadhurst School, the children really enjoy opportunities for creativity and sharing of their own ideas. They have weekly planned sessions of Expressive Arts and Design and the subject is also threaded through the learning environment and other subject areas.

Expressive Arts and Design is one of the seven areas of learning in the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. It develops creativity, the use of imagination and encourages the exploration of media and materials.


Expressive arts and design include any of the following activities:

- Music and dancing.
- Building with construction materials.
- Painting pictures.
- Craft work with different resources.
- Design work- joining materials and creating models.
- Using imagination- role play and drama.
- Using play dough and other malleable materials.

The importance of Expressive Arts and Design in the Early Years:

Expressive Arts and Design gives children the opportunity to explore their creativity and skills and encourages them to find their own method for completing things. Children can experiment with different materials and use their problem solving skills to create something new. It nurtures a love of music and dance and in turn, develops confidence.

Additionally children develop their communication skills within Expressive Arts and Design, as they talk about what they have made and how they might use or improve it.















PANCAKE DAY!

For Pancake Day the children took part in a number of fun activities, including an activity where they chose the toppings to stick on a pancake. They also had a pancake messy play set up to mix their own pancakes. Finally, the children enjoyed eating a pancake. They thoroughly enjoyed them!




IN PHONICS...
