Here are some of the phonics activities we have been doing in the garden.


What other phonics activities can be done outdoors?

Tricky Word Bottle and Hoop Game Children throw a small hoop around a tricky word and see if they can recognise the tricky word they have caught.



Bouncy Blending children say the sound as they hop inside the hoop and then blend the whole word.





Big Writing Sounds children can practise their letter formation by using large scale mark making outside.


This week Class 5 enjoyed sharing what they did over half term break, with their peers, during circle time. Then each child drew a picture of what they had talked about in circle time.

the children recapped all the sounds learnt this year; s, a, t, p, i, n, m, g, d, and o. The children tried hard to make the pure sounds and identified items matching them with the initial sound for each letter.
