I would like to extend a warm greeting to all our children and families as we embark on a new school year. I have enjoyed meeting our new Pre-Nursery children and their families during their first week of school and it has been a pleasure to see them start to settle in their new environment. It has been equally wonderful to welcome back our Nursery children who have settled back into the school routine and are enjoying their new classrooms and getting to know their new teachers.

From next week, I will begin to teach all classes mindfulness. This term, we will be focusing on yoga and learning to be 'present' in the moment. I am very excited to begin and I am sure we will have plenty of fun. I will also be supporting each Nursery class to work with them on assessment preparation. This will continue on a weekly basis until the children have completed their school visits next year.



SETTLING IN

This week, I have had many discussions with parents about the settling in process and how best to support the children in these early days. I have more than ten years' experience settling children into school and I am happy to share some ideas below:

- · It is important to remember that the children will settle. It may take a little time and it may need a change of approach but they will get there.
- · At Broadhurst School, we have a settling in period for all classes, however, it is not unusual for some children to need more time. Every child is unique and we work closely with each family to find the best and most manageable approach for them.
- Try not to worry. Children starting school is a momentous occasion for both parents and children and it can often be a time filled with uncertainty. During times of change, children look to their familiar adults to gauge a new situation. If you are positive and confident about settling, it's more likely this will translate to the children.
- Say goodbye- it is often considered that it is best to disappear quietly whilst your child is distracted. From my experience, this only serves to create further anxiety. Telling your child you are leaving for a short while but you are coming back is very important; this will reassure them.
- Your child may become upset. This is not unexpected during the settling in period. If they are upset, our experienced teachers and assistants will be there to reassure, give cuddles and support them.
- · Please talk to the class teacher if you have any questions. We are keen to work with you through this time.

The children will soon settle and will come into school wearing a big smile. They are making wonderful progress already.
