Eilish Sleator **Headmistress**  This week in Pre-Nursery, the children have been busy practising their numbers, building confidence in recognising them and understanding their correct order. They even had a special visit from a friendly dinosaur who helped them count all the way to five! The children loved joining in and proudly showing off their counting skills.

Alongside this, the class explored the theme of ocean animals, learning about the different creatures that live under the sea and discussing ways we can help to keep our oceans clean. The children shared some very thoughtful ideas about recycling and protecting sea life.

We have also been noticing the seasonal changes taking place around us. Together, we've been observing the signs of autumn - falling leaves, changing colours, and crisp mornings, and using natural materials in our creative play. Some children even brought in apples, conkers, and autumn leaves from their gardens to share with their friends, sparking lots of excitement and curiosity.



















This week in Nursery, the children have been busy exploring a wide range of exciting activities across all areas of learning.

In Communication and Language, they practised speaking in full sentences to describe and discuss their own artwork. As part of Understanding the World, the children learned about the brain and how it helps us think, feel, and make decisions.


In Mathematics, they created and continued AB patterns using beads, shapes, and colours, while during problem-solving sessions they talked about friendship challenges and shared thoughtful ideas for resolving them.

A highlight in Science was exploring calming glitter jars to discover ways to manage big emotions. Through Personal, Social and Emotional Development, the children learned about *marvellous mistakes*, that making mistakes can help us grow and learn new things.

In Literacy, the children enjoyed reading *The Colour Monster* and describing how the characters were feeling before drawing or writing about their own emotions. Finally, in Expressive Arts and Design, they listened to different types of instrumental music and used colours, shapes, and brushstrokes to express how the music made them feel. They also took part in some assessment preparation, matching facial expressions to feelings and explaining the reasons for their choices.
