Pre-Nursery

We have had a wonderfully busy week learning all about how to keep safe on the road as part of Road Safety Week. The children have enjoyed exploring this theme across lots of areas of learning.

In Communication and Language, we supported our listening and attention skills through the much-loved game "Red Light, Green Light." The children had great fun while practising how to stop, go and listen carefully, ideas that link nicely to staying safe outdoors.

Within Understanding the World, we explored how we keep safe on the roads and why it is so important. The children shared their own experiences and thought about ways we can look after ourselves when we are out walking or travelling.

For Personal, Social and Emotional Development, we talked about the importance of catching our coughs and protecting ourselves from germs. Everyone did a brilliant job practising good hygiene and understanding how it helps keep our friends healthy too.

In Literacy, we continued to practise pencil control and strengthen our grip. The children worked hard on developing steady, controlled movements that support early writing skills.

Finally in Phonics, we carried on exploring rhythm and syllables, clapping out the beats in our names and in different objects. This has been a lively and joyful way to build early sound awareness.

We are very proud of the children and all their wonderful learning.























Nursery

What a lovely week we've had in nursery! In phonics, we explored the sounds r and j. The children were fantastic at blending simple CVC words, and they had great fun using the Read Write Inc. rhymes to help form their letters.

In communication and language, we enjoyed lots of talk about road safety. The children showed growing confidence using full sentences and took turns beautifully during role-play conversations.

As part of understanding the world, we learned all about Hanukkah. The children were excited to discover the traditions, symbols and celebrations of this special festival.

Our physical development activities were full of energy and focus. Bead threading helped strengthen little fingers, dreidel spinning brought lots of smiles, and the road safety obstacle course was a big hit!

In maths, we explored subtraction using real objects. The children loved taking items away and proudly explaining how many were left. During problem solving, we sorted pictures into safe and unsafe behaviours and had thoughtful discussions about making good choices.

Our science experiment was full of wonder. We watched coloured water, oil and glitter form magical layers and talked about why they stay separate.

For personal, social and emotional development, we continued thinking about how to keep ourselves safe near roads.

In literacy, the children retold the Hanukkah story using picture cards and created beautifully labelled candles.

Creative sparks were flying during expressive arts and design as the children designed their own zebra crossings and traffic lights made from cardboard tubes.
