Mondrian Class

Our new two-year-old class have settled beautifully into their new environment and are getting used to their new routine. They are already enjoying a range of exciting activities and have been busy exploring stories through play, including feeding the *Very Hungry Caterpillar* and rescuing dinosaurs from the mud.

The children have also enjoyed hands-on sensory experiences using materials such as sand and flour, pouring and transferring them into different containers to build fine motor skills. Imaginative play has been a highlight, with the children playing with the tea set, exploring the role-play area, and building and moving trains along the tracks together.

Music time has been a big hit, with the children enthusiastically singing nursery rhymes such as *Twinkle Twinkle Little Star* and *Old MacDonald*, as well as exploring sounds by playing a variety of instruments.

It's been a wonderful start filled with curiosity, creativity, and lots of smiles as the children continue to grow in confidence each day.



Pre-Nursery

This week, the children have been busy using their **communication and language** skills by choosing objects from a mystery bag and practising how to describe what they can feel and see.

In **Understanding the World**, they explored different types of transport, sorting them into land, water, air, and even space vehicles!

The **physical development** sessions have been full of energy with finger gym activities to strengthen fine motor skills and some fantastic *transport-themed yoga* exercises to get their bodies moving. In **mathematics**, the children began exploring the ideas of *more* and *less* through playful activities.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, helping the children settle back into routine and encouraging independence.

During **literacy**, everyone enjoyed sharing stories about their experiences over the Christmas holidays, while phonics time included a review of our rhyming skills.

In Creative Movement, the children enjoyed listening to a story and going on a pirate adventure on the high seas!

Creativity was in full swing in **expressive arts and design** as we introduced transport songs such as *The Big Red Bus*—lots of singing and smiles all around!

What a busy and exciting week we've had!


In **phonics**, we've been busy recapping all our previously taught sounds and tricky words, helping to refresh our memories after the break. Our **communication and language** sessions were full of giggles as we played "*Would You Rather?*" and practised explaining our choices and listening to others.

We kicked off our new topic "**People Who Help Us**" by learning all about **Paramedics** and the important job they do. This linked perfectly with our hands-on **science experiment**, where we watched a paramedic's glove magically inflate using vinegar and baking soda—lots of amazement all around!



In **physical development**, we worked on strength and balance through calming yoga sessions, while **maths** focused on recapping our number bonds to 5. We also challenged ourselves in **problem solving** by playing games to practise subitising larger numbers.

Our **personal, social and emotional learning** included reading "*Howard Learns to Listen*" and talking about British values, helping us think about good listening and respectful behaviour. During **literacy**, the children loved sharing their holiday news and writing about what they did over the break.

Creativity flowed in **expressive arts and design** as we painted beautiful winter scenes using water colours and snowflakes. We've also been getting ready for assessments by practising drawing different objects, and in **music and movement**, we had great fun learning the ambulance song!
